Subject: Preparation of Annual Action Plans for 2018-19 under MIDH – reg. Sir/ Madam,

I am directed to inform that based on the funds made available under the Budget for the financial year 2018-19 for MIDH, the performance of the States as regards fund utilization during 2017-18 and the broad targets for the MIDH for the year 2018-19, the allocation of funds to different States/UTs/NLAs has been approved by Secretary (DAC&FW) and is given at **Annexure-I.**

- 2. The States/UTs/NLAs are requested to take suitable steps for preparation of Annual Action Plans, 2018-19 based on the allocation approved for the respective States/UTs/NLAs as per Annexure-I.
- 3. While preparing the Annual Action Plan (2018-19), the following points may kindly be taken into consideration:
 - a) The AAP should cater to the outcome expected from various activities under NHM.
 - b) States should focus only on few fruits and vegetables, which may result into maximum outcome in terms of production, productivity, more export and processing resulting in increase in income of farmers. For each of the crops identified, the availability of planting material of existing as well as new varieties should be prepared.
 - c) Activities pertaining to planting material such as new nurseries, seed production, seed import, establishment of tissue culture lab and seed infrastructure should be planned to meet the planting material requirement as assessed above.
 - d) Based upon the availability of planting material and production target, the new area expansion activity should be planned for the focused crops.

- e) <u>Post harvest management activity must be given prominence</u>; at least 30-35% of the budget should be earmarked for setting up of PHM and Marketing infrastructure. The focus should be more on integrated pack-house, ripening chambers, primary processing units and if required, cold storage/CA storage. <u>In Marketing</u>, Apni Mandi to active FPOs should be the priority.
- f) For last few years, investment in protected cultivation has been increasing. The same needs a review in view of the majority of farmers in India are small and marginal farmers and they may not get required assistance for protected cultivation. Possibility should be explored to provide support to FPOs for protected cultivation. In any case, the percentage allocation to this component should not exceed more than 20%.
- g) Some fund under each activity may be kept only for FPOs, particularly for assisting them to have their own market, pack house, primary processing and if possible, cold room/ cold storages.
- h) States/UTs, <u>if so desire</u>, may make provision for 'Flexi Funds' (10 25% of allocation) to undertake mitigation/ restoration activities in case of natural calamities.
- 4. <u>In addition to the broad parameters given in para 3 above</u>, certain targets have been given to the MIDH by the Group of Secretaries, under Outcome Output by NITI Aayog, mitigation of future crisis of onion, increase in area of cashew as per GoS recommendations, budget announcement of Hon'ble FM for the year 2018-19 etc. Since these targets have been given to the Mission as a whole, the same have been distributed amongst various States/UTs based on their capacity and performance during 2017-18.
 - (i) The tentative break-up of State-wise targets under the components of area expansion, protected cultivation, PHM, creation of water sources, nurseries, FPOs / FIGs is given at **Annexure-II**.
 - (ii) Target for Creation of low cost onion storage structures for three States i.e. MP, Gujarat and Rajasthan etc. is given at **Annexure-III**.
 - (iii) Targets for increase of area under cashew in respect of eight States and one NLA are given in **Annexure-IV**.
- 5. <u>In accordance with the Budget announcement 2018-19</u>, States/UTs are required to make sub-plan for development of crop clusters of major crops identified by APEDA/ Mega Food Parks and in the vicinity of CoEs in the state and make provisions in their current years' Action Plan for development of these clusters. To comply with the budget announcements, it has been decided that cluster based model would be implemented in 100 districts across all states. The States are required to identify the districts in this



regard. It has been broadly agreed that the bigger states will have to identify 4 districts and the smaller states would endeavor to implement cluster based development into 2-3 districts. For identifying the horticulture produce for the cluster the states may refer to list of crop specific clusters identified by APEDA (copy enclosed). In addition to the list of APEDA, majority of the States now have the recommendations of the Value Chain Study conducted by the NLAS for the identified crops in particular districts can also be taken into account. The financial outlay for development of clusters should not exceed than 10% of the total outlay.

- 6. Another key announcement in the Budget 2018-19 related to launch of "Operation Greens" on the lines of "Operation Flood" to promote FPOs, Agri Logistics, processing facilities and professional management with particular focus on "TOP" (Tomato, Onion, Potato) to ensure satisfaction to the consumer and returns to the farmers for these perishable commodities. Suitable provisions in the AAP 2018-19 may be considered for "TOP".
- 7. All the States/UTs/NLAs are requested to prepare their respective Annual Action Plans for the year 2018-19 based on the parameters given in para 3 & 4 above. A Video Conference in this regard has been scheduled for 2nd & 3rd April, 2018. Details are given at Annexure-V.
- 8. <u>A Review Meeting is scheduled to be held on 9th & 10th April, 2018 at New Delhi for discussion / finalization of AAP for the year 2018-19</u>.
- 9. All the SMDs are requested to give personal attention for preparation of AAP in a time bound manner and a robust and meaningful presentation of Plan for the year 2018-19.
- 10. The SMDs/Head of National Level Agencies/Implementing Agencies under MIDH are also requested to come to Delhi with the details of Unspent Balance (including funds lying with treasury) as available on 01.04.2018 so that the suitable outlay for spill-over activities of 2017-18 could be incorporated in the AAPs.
